## **Alcohol Disorder Zones**

- After nearly two years of debate, drafting and re-drafting, the Government's proposals for Alcohol Disorder Zones (or 'ADZs') finally came into force on 5<sup>th</sup> June 2008. Licensees whose premises are situated in an area which suffers from alcohol-related nuisance or disorder will be forced to pay the costs of additional policing and council enforcement activity if that area is designated as an ADZ.
- The procedure leading to the designation of an ADZ is complex. It involves a consultation process by the local authority followed by the publication of an "action plan" aimed at making the designation of the area as an ADZ unnecessary. However, the implementation of the action plan may still provide that premises licence holders in the area pay contributions to the costs of extra policing, for example.
- Once the action plan has been implemented, the local authority will decide whether this is sufficient to deal with alcohol-related annoyance to members of the public or disorder in the locality. At this point, if the action plan isn't working, the local authority may designate the area as an ADZ and all licence holders in that area will be required to pay monthly fees.
- Those premises whose principal use is not the sale or supply of alcohol will be exempt from the charge and substantial discounts from the payment may be granted to those licence holders who are able to demonstrate that they have complied with the steps set out in the action plan.
